



The Chartwell Cancer Trust supports children and adults with cancer and leukaemia in Bromley and the surrounding boroughs.

This local charity financially supports the Chartwell Unit, a specialist NHS Cancer and Leukaemia Treatment Unit in the Princess Royal University Hospital, Farnborough, Kent. The CCT funds additional medical staff, capital projects, equipment and training specifically for the unit. Recent projects have included the total refurbishment of the Treatment Suite, computers for the Virtual Cancer Clinics, two specialist wheelchairs and also providing medical pumps and much needed nursing equipment for the community nursing teams.



The CCT Tiger Ward supports the children's cancer and leukaemia Tiger Ward Paediatric Oncology Shared Care Unit in the Queen

Elizabeth Hospital, Woolwich. The ward provides treatment for up to 80 young children. Our support so far has included the installation of a new kitchen for the patients and staff and the ongoing cost of a full time Health Care Assistant specifically for the Ward. We have also provided much needed medical equipment, toys, new televisions, gaming chairs, an interactive magic floor to aid patient mobility, a soft play area, as well as organising fun times and parties on the ward.

The Chartwell Cancer Trust also extends its support to the children's oncology "Frog" room in Croydon University



Hospital. So far, this has included funding for specialist nurse training, equipment, toys and fun times for the children and families undergoing treatment.

The charity also fully funds & runs the local Childhood Cancer Support Groups for children undergoing treatment for cancer or leukaemia in our local and surrounding areas (Bromley, Greenwich & Croydon). This support network offers a lifeline to the child, their siblings and parents at a very difficult time in their lives. Regular monthly meet-ups and trips are organised to provide oncology families with the opportunity to make special memories, whilst having some "normal" time with other families in similar situations.

Our Charity is growing year by year and we are continually increasing the level of support we provide in the community. All of our trustees are volunteers and we raise all our funds through fundraising events, donations and from the advertising in our 'FUNdraising Magazine' which we produce six times a year.
