King Charles III - A few facts

King Charles III is the oldest monarch ever crowned in British history.

He became heir apparent at the age of three! He currently holds the Guinness World Record for the longest heir apparent of 70 years 214 days.

His Majesty reigns not only in the UK, but also in 14 other countries, including Australia, New Zealand, Canada, and Jamaica.

King Charles III became the first heir apparent to attend school, rather than being home-schooled.

Saturday 6 May The King's coronation ceremony will take place at Westminster Abbey; There will be a coronation procession and an appearance on the balcony at Buckingham Palace.

Sunday 7 May: will see hundreds of street parties; and there will be a concert and light show at Windsor Castle.

Monday 8 May: Extra bank holiday
