The new additions to the area are both in the centre of Penge with the works in question being located on Green Lane, and just off of Penge High Street - behind McDonald's on the old toilet block. We love how the work off the high street pops off the surrounding raw brick. However, the second work peeking across the junction at Green Lane and the High Street is our favourite of the two, offering a stack of pure fun for the heart of town. His characters are meticulously created and so clean, consisting of bold solid colours and fluent black lines as inspired by Nol's love of print-making.
